SARA HOSTS GRAYTOWN PARK GRAND OPENING CELEBRATION WITH PDGA DISC GOLF TOURNAMENT

Graytown Park on the San Antonio River Grand Opening and Disc Golf Tournament Aug. 6

ELMENDORF, TX— The San Antonio River Authority (SARA) announced today that it will be holding the Grand Opening Celebration for Graytown Park on the San Antonio River on Saturday, August 6, in Wilson County (1239 CR 125, Elmendorf, TX 78112) from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. Following the ceremony, SARA, in partnership with Alamo Community Disc Club and HouckDesign, will host the Graytown Throwdown, a sanctioned Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) tournament.

The Grand Opening Celebration will include remarks from SARA's General Manager Suzanne Scott, course designer John Houck and the president of the Alamo Community Disc Club. A ceremonial first putt featuring members of the community and local elected officials will close out the grand opening ceremony leading the way to the tournament.

"We are excited that our park is now home to a premier disc golf course designed by John Houck" said Kristen Hansen, SARA's Watershed and Park Operations Manager. "This park has terrain unlike any disc golf course within several hundred miles. We hope this course will bring beginners, amateurs and experienced disc golfers from Texas and beyond."

Graytown Park features include: hiking trails, midpoint access to the SASPAMCO Paddling Trail and a tournament caliber Par 57 level disc golf course designed by the world's premier Disc Golf Course designer, John Houck of HouckDesign.
