SAN ANTONIO, TX — The San Antonio River Authority (SARA) will host the Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC) public meeting on June 17, 2016 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The EAC was established to serve as a comprehensive public participation group that reviews and provides input on environmental studies and programs at SARA. The meeting will be held at SARA's Headquarters, 100 E. Guenther St., San Antonio, TX 78204.
